Short Notice Event: *L'Inhumaine*

Saturday, August 13

This Saturday, the American Film Institute in Silver Spring will be screening the silent film *L'Inhumaine* with live musical accompaniment by the Alloy Orchestra.



Filmed 3 years before the much better known *Metropolis*, *L'Inhumaine* is a groundbreaking silent science fiction film directed by French filmmaker Marcel L'Herbier, who led a team of contributors drawn from the leading lights of the European avant-garde art world. The forward-looking art deco sets are a wonder to behold - the pièce de résistance is a laboratory designed by artist Fernand Léger - as are the gorgeous color tinting and tones.
